FAC Awards \$400,000 in C.A.N Recover Grants and Stipends to Local Artists and Arts Organizations

The Frederick Arts Council is excited to announce that it has awarded \$400,000 in Create and Activate Now (C.A.N.) Recover Grants and Stipends to arts organizations and artists throughout Frederick County!

C.A.N Recover Grants and Stipends support artists and arts organizations who have been impacted by the Coronavirus and need support for upcoming programs and arts projects. This funding opportunity is made possible through a National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) American Rescue Plan (ARP) Grant to Local Arts Agencies (LAA) awarded to the Frederick Arts Council for sub-granting.

"Frederick County artists and arts organizations –and the community as a whole – will benefit from these awards that help activate and energize the local economy through the ripple effects that the arts provide, " said Louise Kennelly, Executive Director of the Frederick Arts Council. "These grants and stipends are an opportunity for the arts to continue healing the community after a challenging time."



To be eligible to receive a Community Arts Development (CAD) grant, your organization must be either a 501(c)(3) nonprofit arts organization or other nonprofit providing arts programming for the community.




MSAC Awards \$65,000 in Folklife Apprenticeships

MSAC's traditional arts program, Maryland Traditions, has awarded \$65,000 to artists in the state through the Folklife Apprenticeship grant. The funding supports the sharing of traditional arts skills from a master artist to an apprentice artist during

a one-year teaching period. Thirteen grants of \$5,000 each have been awarded for the 2022-2023 granting period.

Maryland Traditions has offered Folklife Apprenticeship grants annually since 2004. Applications for additional Folklife Apprenticeships will be accepted twice this year: once beginning in September 2022, and a second round beginning in March 2023. Brain Freeze is back on August 6th!





Adam Tobin is a screenwriter, TV writer, playwright, and improvisor born in Columbia, Maryland and based in Menlo Park, California. He is a Senior Lecturer teaching screenwriting in Stanford University's film & media studies program.

Tobin participated heavily in theater growing up, including with Betty May's Onstage Productions. He attended Howard High School. In his sophomore year, he completed a "mentorship" program with horror writer Thomas F. Monteleone, composing a series of short stories with fantastical themes.

Tobin received an English degree from Stanford and then moved to Los Angeles, where he performed with Los Angeles Theatresports, attended

USC School of Cinematic Arts for an MFA in screenwriting, and worked as a story analyst at Jim Henson Pictures. An avid Muppet fan, Tobin helped in the development of Muppets in Space and Elmo in Grouchland.

In 1999, Tobin moved to New York and found work on gameshows including ESPN's 2-Minute Drill and Who Wants to Be a Millionaire, where he once wrote a \$10-million dollar trivia question.

His inclusion as a finalist in HBO's Project Greenlight in 2003 put his romantic comedy Odd Jobs on display and led to him create the reality show Best Friend's Date and the scripted comedy About a Girl for Nickelodeon's The-N Network (now rebranded as TeenNick.) "I've gotta be the only instructor at Stanford who's been a contestant on and created a reality show," Tobin says.

In 2008, after writing About a Girl in Los Angeles and filming it in Vancouver, Tobin was hired to teach screenwriting at his alma mater, where he "happily offers the course material I had to go to grad school to get." While there, he reconnected with classmate Deborah Wicks La Puma, a prominent composer of musicals for young audiences. Together they conceived of a new show based on Chelsea Clinton's children's book, She Persisted.






