Artist & Arts Organization Opportunity: Maryland State Arts Council Creativity Grants





The purpose of the MSAC Creativity Grant Program is to strengthen the vitality and sustainability of artists and small organizations to maintain a strong and stable arts infrastructure in the State of Maryland. The Creativity Grant also provides opportunities to serve the growing needs of relevant arts projects and collaborations within Maryland communities. Applicants may only submit one application per fiscal year (July 1 - June 30).

The Creativity Grant Program supports eligible activities of Independent Artists and Small Organizations with grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,500. There is no matching fund requirement for Creativity Grants.

Deadlines for the Creativity Grant Program are rolling. MSAC is now accepting applications for the FY20 cycle (grant period July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020). Funded activities must occur within the grant period and begin no more than 90 days following submission of an application. Applications will be reviewed monthly, and Creativity Grants will be awarded throughout the fiscal year until allocated funding is depleted.



The Hood College International Humanities Film Series will show Alfred Hitchcock's 1938 mystery "The Lady Vanishes" on April 19 at 7 p.m. in Hodson Auditorium in Rosenstock Hall.

The film follows a group of travelers on a train headed for England. When the train is delayed by an avalanche, the travelers are holed up in a hotel in a fictional European country. Young Iris (Margaret Lockwood) befriends elderly Miss Froy (Dame May Whitty). When the train resumes, Iris suffers a bout of unconsciousness and wakes to find the old woman has disappeared. The other passengers ominously deny Miss Froy ever existed, so Iris begins to investigate with another traveler (Michael Redgrave) and,

as the pair sleuth, romantic sparks fly.

Frederick Book Arts Center Presents: Visiting Artists Anna Hepler and Haig Demarjian




Two New England artists; book-artist and sculptor, Anna Helper and printmaker/filmmaker Haig Demarjian will discuss their artistic journeys and unveil new works on April 27th at 5pm at the Frederick Book Arts Center (FBAC), 217 W. Patrick Street. They will each be teaching a two-day workshop on the 27th and 28th as well. More information at www.frederickbookarts.org

If you're familiar with the indie film Die You Zombie Bastards, then you're familiar with the images of the film's co-creator, Haig Demarjian. For the past two years, Haig has been working on a 15-foot scroll that will be

unveiled for the first time at his FBAC exhibition. Not only will participants get a sneak preview of this "magnum opus" but they will get the inside scoop on Haig and Anna's processes - Haig's newest experiments in blacklight, reactive inks and Anna's transition from the micro-level of book-arts to the macro-level of her organic, gigantic sculptures.

Anna and Haig will also teach classes on the 27th and 28th: 9am-12pm Anna teaches relief printmaking, pressure printing and color reduction woodcuts. 1pm-4pm Haig teaches non-toxic intaglio printmaking. The Frederick Book Art Center (FBAC) is dedicated to teaching the crafts associated with the Art of the Book, to providing artists the space and resources to practice these crafts, and to further public exposure and appreciation for the Art of the Book.

Maryland Author: Stephen Hunter Genre: Thriller

Stephen Hunter is an award winning American novelist, essayist, and film critic. He was born in Kansas City, Missouri, and grew up in Evanston, Illinois. His mother wrote children's books. The Army drafted him for two years after he graduated from Northwestern with a degree in journalism. He serving in The Old Guard in Washington, D.C., and wrote for the Pentagon News. He joined The Baltimore Sun in 1971, working on the Sunday edition. He became its film critic in 1982, and held that position till he moved to The Washington Post in 1997. In 1998 Hunter won the American Society of Newspaper Editors Distinguished Writing Award in the criticism category, and in 2003 he received the Pulitzer

Prize for Criticism. Hunter is a firearms enthusiast who expertly weaves his knowledge of rifles and pistols into each thrillers as he describes in detail the features and capabilities of the weapons used by his main character, Bob "the Nailer" Swagger, who is a Vietnam War veteran and sniper. Stephen Hunter has written over twenty novels and still lives in Baltimore.

Genre: Thriller - Thrillers are characterized by their ability to give readers heightened feelings of suspense, excitement, surprise, anticipation, and anxiety. Thrillers generally keep readers "up all night" as they wade through red herrings, plot twists, and the cover-up of important information on their way to the plot's climax. Crucial to a thriller's plot is a prominent villain who creates the obstacles that the hero must overcome.

A partial reading list includes: Bob Lee Swagger Series: Point of Impact, Time to Hunt, Night of Thunder, The Sniper, Dead Zero, The Third Bullet, Sniper's Honor, Game of Sniper.
