Artist & Arts Organization Opportunity: Maryland State Arts Council Creativity Grants



The purpose of the MSAC Creativity Grant Program is to strengthen the vitality and sustainability of artists and small organizations to maintain a strong and stable arts infrastructure in the State of Maryland. The Creativity Grant also provides opportunities to serve the growing needs of relevant arts projects and collaborations within Maryland communities. Applicants may only submit one application per fiscal year (July 1 - June 30).

The Creativity Grant Program supports eligible activities of Independent Artists and Small Organizations with grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,500. There is no matching fund requirement for Creativity Grants.

Deadlines for the Creativity Grant Program are rolling. MSAC is now accepting applications for the FY20 cycle (grant period July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020). Funded activities must occur within the grant period and begin no more than 90 days following submission of an application. Applications will be reviewed monthly, and Creativity Grants will be awarded throughout the fiscal year until allocated funding is depleted.

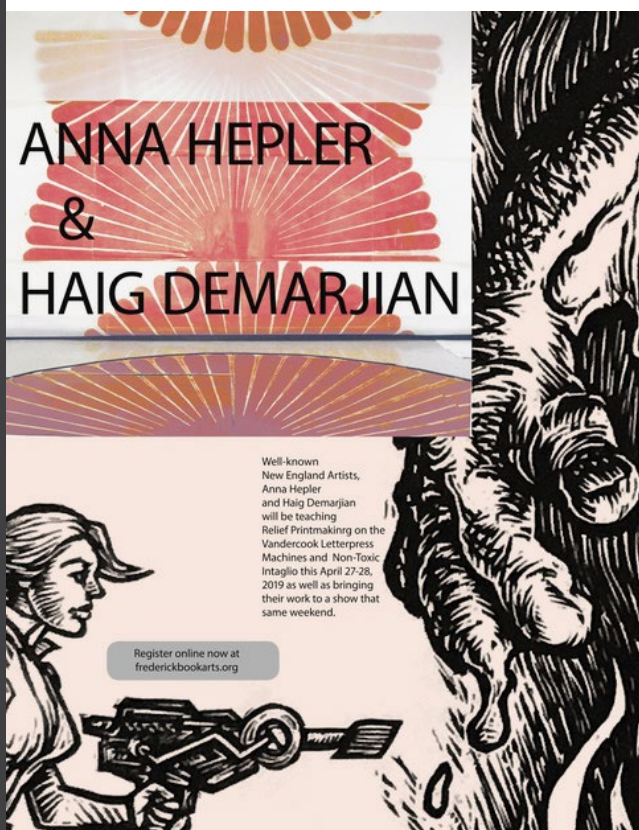

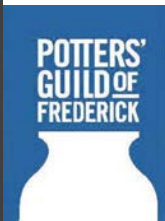

Maryland Author: Stephen Hunter

Genre: Thriller

Stephen Hunter is an award winning American novelist, essayist, and film critic. He was born in Kansas City, Missouri, and grew up in Evanston, Illinois. His mother wrote children's books. The Army drafted him for two years after he graduated from Northwestern with a degree in journalism. He serving in The Old Guard in Washington, D.C., and wrote for the Pentagon News. He joined The Baltimore Sun in 1971, working on the Sunday edition. He became its film critic in 1982, and held that position till he moved to The Washington Post in 1997. In 1998 Hunter won the American Society of Newspaper Editors Distinguished Writing Award in the criticism category, and in 2003 he received the Pulitzer

Prize for Criticism. Hunter is a firearms enthusiast who expertly weaves his knowledge of rifles and pistols into each thrillers as he describes in detail the features and capabilities of the weapons used by his main character, Bob "the Nailer" Swagger, who is a Vietnam War veteran and sniper. Stephen Hunter has written over twenty novels and still lives in Baltimore.

Genre: Thriller - Thrillers are characterized by their ability to give readers heightened feelings of suspense, excitement, surprise, anticipation, and anxiety. Thrillers generally keep readers "up all night" as they wade through red herrings, plot twists, and the cover-up of important information on their way to the plot's climax. Crucial to a thriller's plot is a prominent villain who creates the obstacles that the hero must overcome.

A partial reading list includes: *Bob Lee Swagger Series: Point of Impact, Time to Hunt, Night of Thunder, The Sniper, Dead Zero, The Third Bullet, Sniper's Honor, Game of Sniper.*

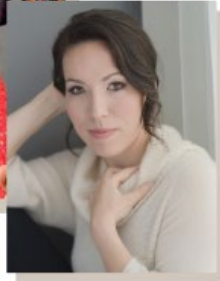

Returning to the music of Arnold Schoenberg, the NSS presents *Verklärte Nacht*, one of the most important string orchestra works of the Romantic era. Originally composed as a string sextet, Schoenberg arranged "*Verklärte Nacht*" ("*Transfigured Night*") for string orchestra in 1917, then revised it again in 1943. Among Schoenberg's earliest important works, it was inspired by a poem of redemption and forgiveness by Richard Dehmel. (It was also inspired by his infatuation with the sister of his music teacher, whom he would later marry.)

Schoenberg Controversial at its debut, this work has become one of the most important tone poems ever written.



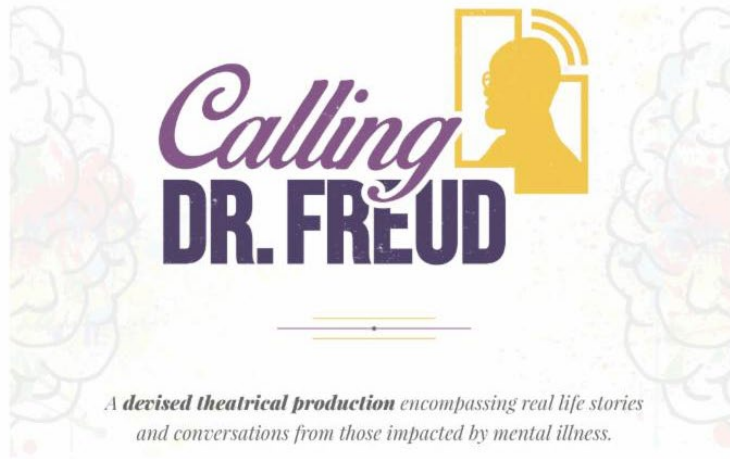

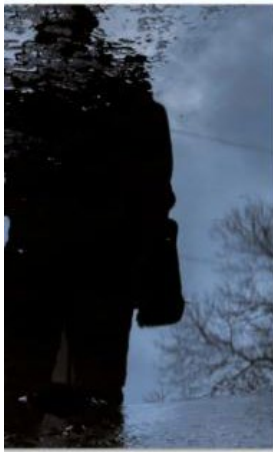

TAG member and mixed-media artist Karen Peacock shares her vision of an alternative universe populated by rulers in her show titled "Monarchs of Mariland." Using collage, paint and digital photography she creates fictitious characters to rule this "Mariland". 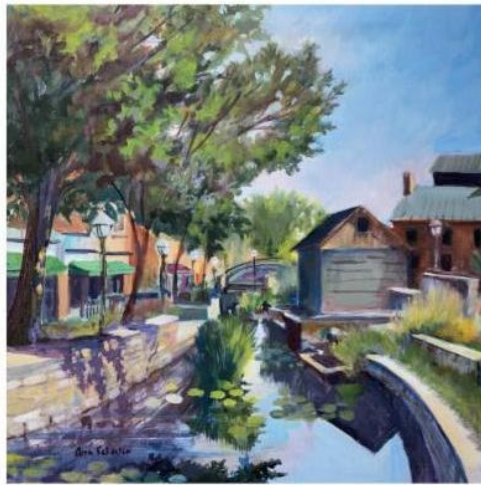

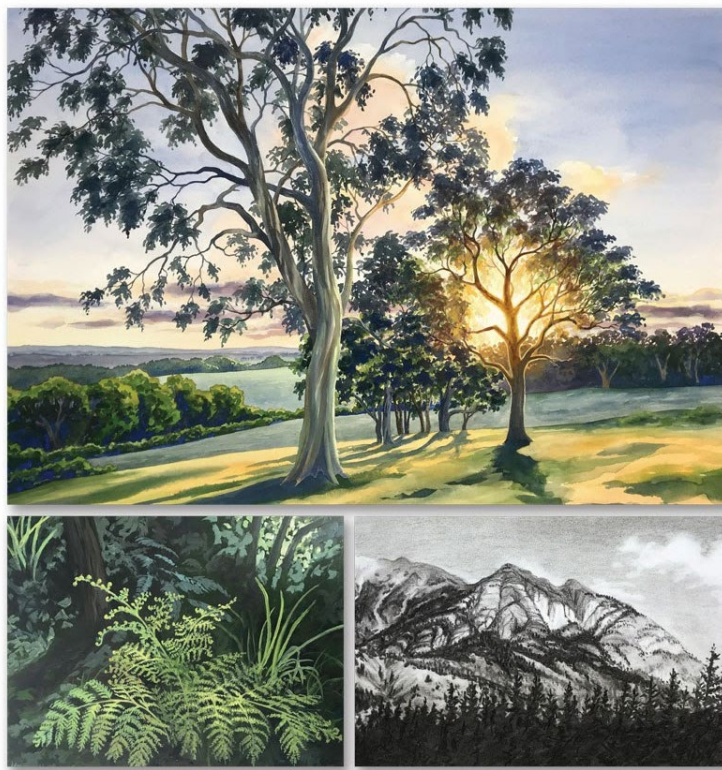
