DETAILS

Hood College alumnus Taurean Washington '11 will exhibit his work in an upcoming show called "The Re-Education of Taurean Washington."

Washington's work is an eclectic mix of modern and contemporary art. As a fan of hip-hop music, he taps into the art of "sampling," in which lyrics from different songs are referenced directly or indirectly in each piece. Audio instrumentals are also used as a backdrop to provide a soundtrack for the viewer to follow. He has coined the phrase "Art-Hop," which describes his hip-hop inspired art.

Born 1985 in Fort Worth, Texas, Washington earned his bachelor's degree in studio art from Hood College in 2011. Prominent African-American artists such as Jean Michel Basquiat, Robert Colescott and Kerry James Marshall are role models for him.







Maryland Author: Poet Laureate Grace Cavalieri

Grace Cavalieri (1932 - . . .) is an Italian American writer living in Annapolis, MD. During her 43-year career as a poet and playwright she has published 24 books, produced 26 plays, and hosted over 2,000 episodes *The Poet and the Poem*, a radio show presented by the Library of Congress through National Public Radio. She is the author of numerous collections of poetry. Her talent has been recognized through awards that include the Corporation for Public Broadcasting Silver Medal, the Columbia Award from the Folger Shakespeare Library, and the Allen Ginsberg Poetry Award.

A strong believer in higher education, Cavalieri has attended and graduated from New Jersey College at Trenton (BS - Education: English and History) and Goddard University (MA - Creative Writing & Education). She has also studied at the University of

Maryland and Graduate School of Education, Rollins University, Orlando.

In December of 2018, Governor Larry Hogan (R) appointed Grace Cavalieri as Maryland's 10th Poet Laureate. The position, created by the Maryland General Assembly in 1959, has a 4-year term. As Poet Laureate, Cavalieri is responsible to accompany the Governor and provide readings at public events and receptions. She makes appearances and holds readings in schools, universities, and libraries around the state. She presents lectures and/or poetry writing workshops as well as connects with literary organizations and festivals across the state. In this regard, she has teamed up with the Maryland Writers Association Poetry Contest as one of its judges. Finally, she has to write new works to honor special occasions, venue openings, and dedications.

"My emphasis is really state poetry and I'm ready to go, really," she said. "I want this to be something where we can keep the excitement happening and post things everyone can be part of. I'm so glad to be given the energy for this new chapter of my life."

Genre: Poetry – Poetry is a form of literature that evokes a concentrated imaginative awareness of experience or a specific emotional response through language chosen and arranged for its meaning, sound, and rhythm.





