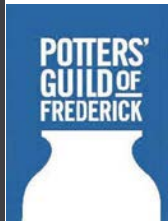

Frederick Children's Chorus Announces Executive Director & Associate Choral Director



The Board of Directors of The Frederick Children's Chorus is pleased to announce the promotion of Lee Fuhr to the position of Executive Director. Mrs. Fuhr is a long-time member of the musical and administrative staff of the organization, as well as being an alumna, having sung 14 years in the chorus.

Prior to her work with The Frederick Children's Chorus, Mrs. Fuhr attended Towson University, where she received a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Computer Information Systems. While at Towson, she sang in the Towson Chorale and Chamber Singers, under the direction of Dr. Paul Rardin. She also performed with the Baltimore Choral Arts Society under the direction of Tom Hall. After college, Mrs. Fuhr worked in the field of finance and held positions at Music & Arts Headquarters and Common Market, both in Frederick.

Mrs. Fuhr has been a member of the chorus staff since May, 2004, first serving as Assistant Director, then adding Office Manager to her duties. Mrs. Fuhr has directed both the Training Chorus (grades 3-6) and Chamber Singers (grades 9-12). In 2017, she was promoted to Director, serving as the administrative staff leadership and leading several Hood College interns. She has become the face of the organization over the past 2 years, interfacing with the business and non-profit community, earning more private and public donations than ever before, and launching an expansion for the Little Music Makers program, bringing world class vocal education to the youngest members of our community.



The Frederick Children's Chorus is very pleased to announce that Jessica Parsley Cummings has accepted the position of Associate Choral Director. Mrs. Cummings will begin effective July 1, 2019 and will assume responsibility of directing the Frederick Chamber Singers. This appointment is the culmination of a nearly thirty-year association with The Frederick Children's Chorus that began when she joined the chorus as a student.

Mrs. Cummings is an Adjunct Professor at the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University, where she prepares pre-service music educators to teach elementary general music and choir in secondary schools. Mrs. Cummings earned her Masters of Music Education from The Florida State University (FL), where she studied voice with Roy Delp and conducting with Dr. Andre Thomas, Dr. Kevin Fenton and Dr. Judy Bowers. She earned her Bachelors of Music in Music Education from DePaul University (IL), where she studied voice with Ashley Putman and Susanne Mentzer and conducting with Dr. Clayton Parr and Dr. Michael V. Smith.

Prior to coming to Peabody, Mrs. Cummings taught high school choir and general music in both Howard and Frederick Counties, and elementary and middle general music and choir in the Chicago-land area. While in Frederick County, Mrs. Cummings taught at Middletown High School and Oakdale High School. Her choirs have been invited to perform at Maryland Music Educator Association Conferences, the PBS special Celebrate America, NBC's Sounds of the Season, Carnegie Hall, and many state and national festivals where they received superior ratings. Her students have been selected to sing in All County Choirs, All State Choirs, the NAFME All Eastern Honor Choir and the NAFME All National Choir.

An avid soprano soloist, she has performed with the Baltimore Choral Arts Society under Tom Hall, the Concert Artists of Baltimore under Edward Polochick, the Chicago Chamber Choir under Timothy Adams, Da Corneto Opera Company (IL), and is in frequent demand as a soprano soloist and section-leader in numerous churches in the Maryland and DC areas. She is a Past President of the Maryland Choral Educators Association.

Michael S. Glaser was born in Chicago, Illinois in 1943, received his B.A. from Denison University and his M.A. and Ph.D. from Kent State University. Glaser served as Poet Laureate of Maryland from 2004 – 2009. Over 500 of Glaser's poems have been published in literary journals and newspapers such as *American Scholar*, *New Letters*, *Prairie Schooner*, *Christian Science Monitor*, *The Antioch Review*, *The Progressive Magazine* and *Sacred Journey*. He is a Professor Emeritus at St. Mary's College of Maryland where he served as both a professor of English and an administrator for nearly 40 years.

While at St. Mary's, he co-founded and directed their annual Literary Festival as well as the VOICES literary reading series. He is a recipient of the Homer Dodge Endowed Award for Excellence in Teaching, Glaser as well as the Poetry Committee of the Greater Washington's Columbia Merit Award for his service to poetry. Loyola College awarded him the Andrew White Medal for his dedication to the intellectual and scholarly life, and for his commitment to sustaining the poetic tradition in the State of Maryland. He served as a Maryland State Arts Council poet-in-the-schools for over 25 years. He writes poetry reviews for *The Friends Journal*, and co-leads retreats which embrace the reading and writing of poetry as a means of self-reflection, personal growth, and meaningful engagement in the world.

He lives in St. Mary's City, Maryland with his wife and educator, Kathleen W. Glaser, who works with the Center for Courage and Renewal. The Glaser's enjoy five grown children and ten grandchildren.

Genre: Poetry – Poetry is a form of literature that evokes a concentrated imaginative awareness of experience or a specific emotional response through language chosen and arranged for its meaning, sound, and rhythm. Glaser firmly believes in the power of poetry to reflect upon what it means to be human.

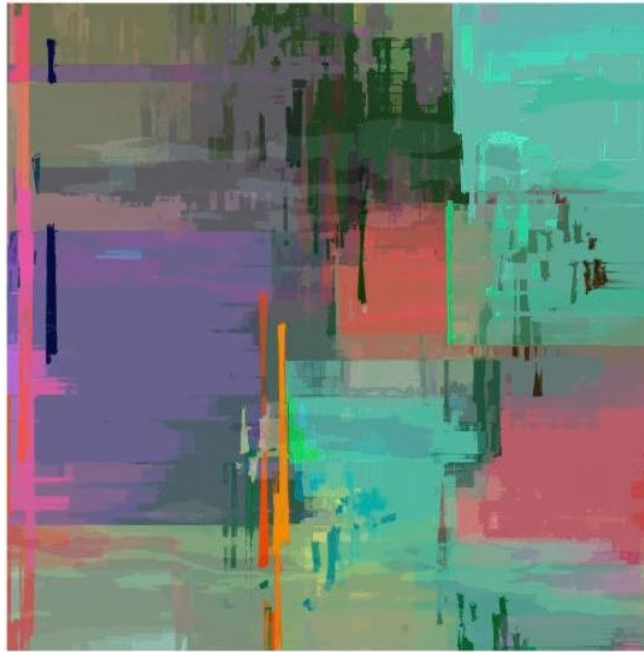

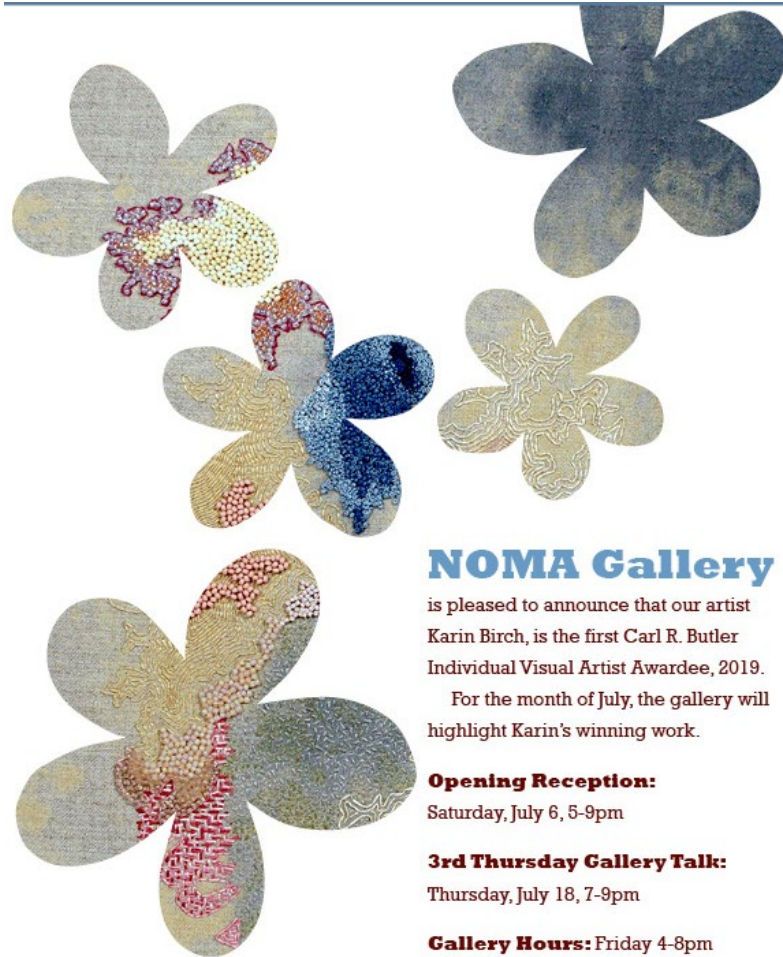

Love, or Something Better: New Work by Ash Cheshire and Jillian Abir MacMaster



The upcoming art exhibition Love, or Something Better explores the complexity of human connection and self-reflection on queer relationships, sexuality, and identity. Both Ash Cheshire and Jillian Abir MacMaster manipulate found objects to dissect their navigations through love, sex, and mental health. Cheshire utilizes antique art and sculpture with text and abrasive paint application. MacMaster manipulates images from vintage women's health and beauty publications using a document scanner to visually and thematically warp and collage the original content.
