Frederick Arts Council Receives Multi-Year Focus Grant Award from Ausherman Family Foundation

The Frederick Arts Council announces that the organization has been awarded a \$252,000 Focus Grant from the Ausherman Family Foundation. These grants are by invitation only and designed to be a three- to five-year commitment to help an organization get a select project or program started while allowing them time to make it self-sustainable. The Frederick Arts Council will utilize the grant to establish the countywide public art program outlined in its recently completed Public Art Master Plan.

Leaving the wreckage of Act I, we venture back into nature. What was once sturdy has failed and crumbled. Act II proposes not reaction, but a full reevaluation. We search for a new life force, floating somewhere in a sea of collapse.

In a four channel video opera, three millennials travel and labor to turn water into steam. Enacting a contemporary ritual, they defy an old proverb, turning what is typically a means to an end into an end in and of itself. They meditate on the phase change and learn from its will.

The video is housed in a boat on a sea of brick taken from homes long gone. Laying by the boat are pages from notebooks and diaries, alongside the ritual's musical score. Moments, plans, ideas.

Through written word, visitors are invited to contribute their thoughts or experiences

and add them to the remnants of others.

Exhibit Featuring 1980s and 1990s Objects on Display at Hood College



An art exhibition of hand-cut paper sculptures integrated with found objects from the 1980s and 1990s will be on display Aug. 29 through Oct. 20 at Hood College.


The exhibit, "Video Viscera," by South Carolina-based artist Charles Clary is a blend of intricate sculptures constructed by layering dozens of vividly-colored, hand-cut, concentric shapes with three-dimensional found objects such as old VCR tape boxes and children's toys. The exhibit, in the Hodson Gallery in the Tatem Arts Center, will be open daily from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Clary's creations are the result of a deep personal tragedy-

the death of his parents to smoking-related cancers in February 2013. He views the retro-pop culture items as representations of how he escaped into a realm of childhood fantasy and fiction to cope with his everyday realities. The movies and games became the surrogate parents he longed for, and provided him the means to find order in the chaos of sickness and loss. The paper sculptures, which mimic microbes or viral colonies, deteriorate the surface of the objects and grow, much like a cancer, into the interior

Clary was born in 1980 in Morristown, Tennessee. He earned his bachelor's degree in painting from Middle Tennessee State University and his master's degree in painting from the Savannah College of Art and Design. He has shown in exhibitions across the eastern U.S. and internationally. Clary has also been featured in publications including 500 Paper Objects, Paper Works, Paper Art, Papercraft 2, PUSH: Paper, and The New Twenties. In 2016, he won the top prize at the ArtFields Competition in Lake City, South Carolina, an annual, nine-day exhibition and art competition that draws entrants from across the country. Clary currently resides in Conway, South Carolina, and is a professor at Coastal Carolina University.





Notable Maryland Author

Maryland Author: Samuel Dashiell Hammett Genre: Hard-Boiled Crime

"All my characters were based on people I've known personally, or known about." Dashiell Hammett



Samuel Dashiell Hammett, (May 27, 1894 – January 10, 1961) was born on a farm in St Mary's County, Maryland and grew up in Philadelphia and Baltimore. He worked as an operative for the Pinkerton National Detective Agency from 1915 to February 1922, with time off to serve in World War I. Hammett was first published in 1922 starting the genre that was eventually labeled Hard-Boiled Crime. Authors are told to "write what you know" and Hammett lived in San Francisco and knew Pinkerton detective work. Nosy couple Nick and Nora Charles and hard-boiled private eye Sam Spade are the enduring characters Hammet created. They lived and sleuthed in the streets, sounds, and locations of San Francisco using language that was authentic to the era and

work. His 1929 novel *Red Harvest* was selected by Time magazine as one of the 100 best Englishlanguage novels published between 1923 and 2005. He wrote his final novel in 1934, more than 25 years before his death and is widely regarded as one of the finest mystery writers of all time. A veteran of both world wars, Hammett is buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

Genre: Hard-Boiled Crime – Hard-boiled Crime is a tough, unsentimental style of American crime writing that brings an earthy realism or naturalism to the field of detective fiction. Hard-boiled fiction contains vivid, but often sordid urban backgrounds, fast-paced, slangy dialogue and graphic sex and violence.
