## BARN PROJECT

### CALL SUMMARY

The Frederick Arts Council is seeking qualifications for Artist /Teams to submit their proposals for artworks to be displayed on and around multiple barns throughout Frederick County. Applications are due on February 1, 2021, and finalists will be selected by March 1, 2021.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Frederick Arts Council is commissioning artists to design and execute works to be displayed on barn exteriors throughout Frederick County. The work should be a temporary installation, ideally designed using natural or found materials which reflect the subtle beauty of the environment. Land art will also be considered although we request that artists take into account the possible necessities of barn owners. Projects spanning multiple barns will be considered.

### QUALIFICATIONS

At this stage, we are requesting that interested applicants submit their CV, examples of their past work, as well as a link to their website or other portfolio platform.

### BUDGET

The budget for each barn is \$2,000. Currently there are up to 20 barns available for use.

The Frederick Arts Council is seeking qualifications for Artist /Teams to submit their proposals for a mural to be displayed on 101 W Potomac St, a property containing three connected walls in Brunswick, MD. Applications are due on February 1, 2021, and finalists will be selected by March 1, 2021.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Frederick Arts Council is commissioning artists to design and execute a mural on 101 W Potomac St, a property containing three connected walls on a property in Brunswick, MD. This property is in close proximity to a public art project in the midst of realization – the Brunswick Archway. Applicants should research the archway and give consideration to potential conceptual links between the archway and mural. The artist should also take into account the age of the walls and consider any wall repairs before proceeding with mural installation.

**Design Selected for Brunswick Archway**



The Frederick Arts Council announces that a design has been selected for the Brunswick Archway project. The Brunswick Archway will be a steel and stone gateway arch located at the entrance to South Maple Avenue welcoming train commuters, C&O Canal towpath hikers and cyclists to the City of Brunswick.

Designed and realized by artist Dayton Castleman of Verdant Studio, the Brunswick Archway's motif is adapted from the camel back truss structure of the 1893 Potomac bridge constructed by the Youngstown Bridge Company. The archway will reflect Brunswick's rich history and a recognizable historical landmark.

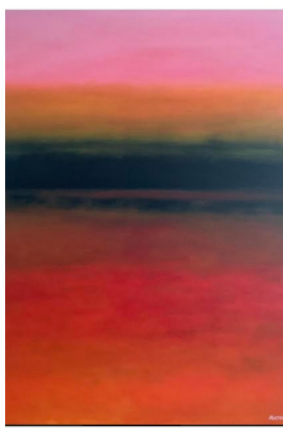

## **FY2021 Network Technical Assistance Grants Open rolling through April 1, 2021**

The intention of the Network Technical Assistance grant is to support organizational development activities beyond the scope of regular activities funded by Arts & Entertainment District Operating Support, County Arts Development, or Folklife Network grants.

Organizational development is defined as any effort that supports the stability, visibility, and effectiveness of an organization. This broad definition means that organizational development looks different based on each organization's unique needs. Contact relevant MSAC staff to discuss typical activities funded by Network Technical Assistance grants.

**Funding:** Grants are between \$500 and \$2,000 and are disbursed based on applicant requests. Grants may fund the entirety or a portion of an applicant's proposed organizational development activity.

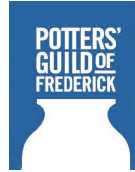

Author: Colby Rodowsky

"I find that a lot of my remembering has to do with books..." – Colby Rodowsky

Rodowsky (1932-2020) born in Baltimore, grew up in New York, Washington, D.C., and Baltimore again. She spent part of every summer with her grandmother on Virginia's Eastern Shore, where the days were "long and hot and there was absolutely nothing to do." Then she discovered the library (it had been a church) which she visited the three afternoons a week it was open as well as her grandmother's attic, that held all the books her mother and aunt had read as children. She began to read.

As a child something kept prodding her to be a writer. Once, when she was about ten years old, she woke her mother in the middle of the night and said, "Who shall I dedicate my first book to?" Her mother said matter of factly, "Why don't you write it first."

Rodowsky attended a Georgetown preparatory school and then enrolled in Maryland's College of Notre Dame. There she edited the college literary magazine, worked on the yearbook, and wrote poetry extensively. She graduated with an English degree and became an elementary school teacher for third grade and special needs children. She dedicated herself as a stay-at-home mom when the first of their six children arrived. As she said, "I got married (to a lawyer who is now a judge) and had six children (five girls and one boy) and learned to make cupcakes and Halloween costumes and peanut-butter-and-jelly sandwiches."

One of Rodowsky's former teachers visited and inspired her writing career. "We weren't talking about writing; we were just talking about books," Rodowsky said. Sister Maura "stopped what she was saying and looked at me and said, 'Just think; you have all your writing still ahead of you.'" "So, at 40, when her children were old enough to make their own cupcakes and Halloween costumes, Rodowsky responded to her urges and began to write for children and young adults. Her stories reflect her early life and her young characters live in a tough world characterized by unpredictable events and undependable authority figures. Their efforts to cope with parental abandonment, poverty, and even death, are aided by warm and loving individuals. Frequently, because of their meaning to Rodowsky, libraries and attics pop up in the stories she writes.

She received an American Library Association Notable Book citation for *Not My Dog* and *The Gathering Room*, the School Library Journal Best Books of the Year citation for *Sydney, Herself*; and a Best Books for Young Adults citation for *Julie's Daughter*, *Hannah in Between*, and *Remembering Mog*.

Genre: Children's Literature – Children's literature or juvenile literature includes stories, books, magazines, and poems made for children. Rodowsky writes stories that feature children going through tough times and being helped and encouraged by an adult outside the immediate family.
