MSAC is pleased to share the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for artists or teams of artists to design and create a Maryland Monument to honor Black Patriots who served in the Revolutionary War. After the RFQ period, selected qualified artists will be invited to submit proposals for consideration to create and install the monument on the grounds of the Maryland State House in Annapolis.

The idea for a memorial artwork was initially proposed by Steven X. Lee, the author of 'The Story of Mr. Thomas Carney - A Maryland Patriot of the American Revolutionary War.' Over 150 Maryland African Americans, including free and enslaved individuals, served in the Revolutionary War alongside free and enslaved women and children, whose legacy is a largely omitted chapter in Maryland's Black history. The purpose of the sculpture is to honor and acknowledge the often-overlooked history of the African American community in early Maryland with a monument that expands public understanding of the people who contributed to the fight for American independence. It should celebrate the contributions of Maryland's free Black population to our state and country through figurative depictions and the selected artist's interpretation.

The budget includes a \$5,000 proposal fee for four semi-finalists and a \$500,000 budget for the artwork. View the full RFQ, including project and submission details, by <u>clicking here</u>.

"Sometimes a blessing can be a curse." Amy L. Kaplan



A.L. Kaplan's love of books started as a child and sparked her creative imagination. Born on a cold winter morning in scenic northern New Jersey, her stories and poems have been included in several anthologies and magazines. "For as long as I can remember" said Kaplan, "I've created stories, pictures, and sculptures."

Kaplan was hooked on writing when she won a prize for illustrating a story in first grade. Then in middle school, an art teacher saw her aluminum foil sculptures and convinced Kaplan to take art. Thus was her creative path chosen.

"Through all of this," Kaplan continued, "stories continued to spin through my mind and keep me up at night as I rewrote scenes multiple times." She found out that translating to the written word was entirely different, and often felt frustrated and stifled. She had wonderful speeches in her head that wouldn't transfer to the written

word. Her 'artistic' handwriting and 'creative' spelling got in the way. Her teachers didn't appreciate that kind of creativity. Instead, the stories in her head came out in her paintings and sculptures. At college, she gained the confidence (and an introduction to computers) to write creatively. The images in her mind finally gained a literary narrative and eventually dialogue.




CALL for ARTISTS


Glen Echo Park's 53rd Annual Labor Day Art Show



Esquivando las Miradas by Juan Santos



Juan Santos was born in the Bronx, New York City, and later lived in a community of Puerto Rican single mothers in inner city Boston. Santos earned his MFA in Visual Art at Lesley University in Cambridge, MA, and now teaches art at Boston Day and Evening Academy, an alternative high school in Boston. His students often live in dystopian worlds of their own. Using the visual language of cartoons and the street language of graffiti, Santos is able to relate to his students about contemporary fears and trauma. He uses the language of comics and the recurring image of a cartoonish bird to address the difficult themes so many young people are facing.
