This project was commissioned by the Frederick Arts Council and made possible by the Ausherman Family Foundation in partnership with Pleasants Construction, Inc.







In August, George Koch launched this series, and the group is producing a short video of his most salient insights from his work establishing successful spaces.


Artist Opportunity: Artist of the Month Program with Cowork Frederick

Cowork Frederick is particularly interested in artists who may not have had a chance to have an exhibition of their own yet.


