CALL SUMMARY

The Frederick Arts Council is seeking qualifications for Artist /Teams in the first phase of the Charrette for Roundabouts exhibition. Selected applicants will be given \$600 to propose an idea and construct a model to be displayed at the Charrette for Roundabouts exhibition. Applications are due on October 22, 2021 and the Art Center exhibition will now take place in winter of 2021-22.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Charrette [DEF]: *A collaborative planning process that harnesses the talents and energies of all interested parties to inform an initiative that represents transformative community change.*

The goal of the charrette exhibition is to spark discussion and innovation about the potential for artwork at Frederick gateways to activate Frederick's unique identity. Once artists are selected, each will propose an idea that builds upon a common idea/ theme to enhance the county's entryways and roundabouts, turning important transitions in and out of Frederick into distinct zones that facilitate unique

and memorable experiences. In tandem with soliciting artist qualifications and proposals, the Frederick Arts Council will seek input and entries from interested residents, students, and community members via a public open call.

At this stage, we are requesting that interested artists submit their CV, examples of past work, and a link to their website or other portfolio platform.

Artists of selected ideas will be invited to make a model for \$600

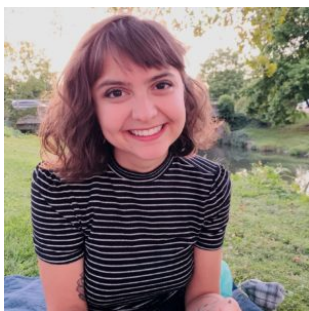
Luc has an extensive background in metal fabrication and bronze casting. His sculptures are collected widely both privately and publicly and are in galleries across the country.

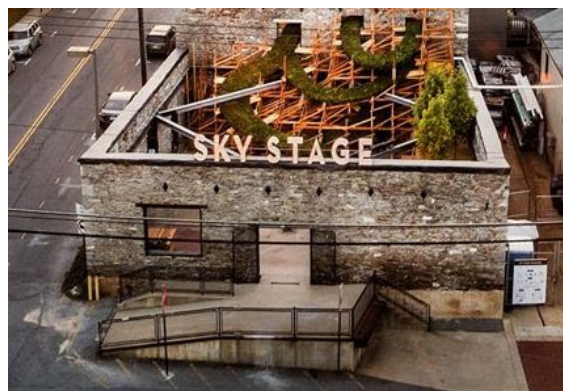


2022 Heritage Award Nominations Open September 1st

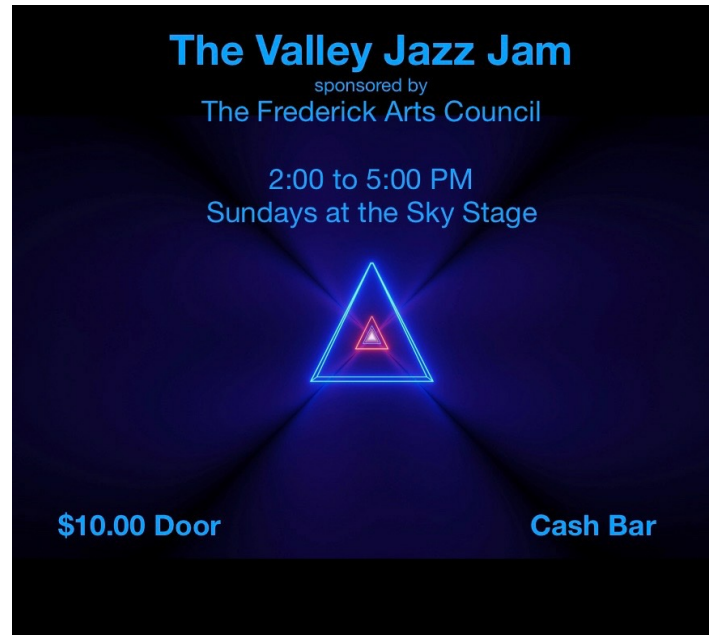

We invite you to nominate individuals, places, and traditions for outstanding achievement in traditional arts and culture. Awards are \$5,000 each. Nominations are due Friday, October 15, at 5 p.m. Begin a nomination using MSAC's application system, SmartSimple. Log in to SmartSimple or create a free account at marylandarts.smartsimple.com.

Maryland Traditions, the traditional arts program of MSAC, has given Heritage Awards annually since 2007. Awards are given based on a nominee's sustained commitment to a particular traditional practice, current importance to communities in which that traditional practice is important, and past contributions to that traditional practice. Each year, winners are chosen in the categories of Person or People, Place, and Tradition. 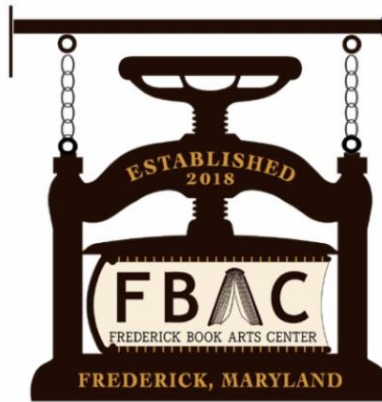

Claire McCardell Statue Set for Unveiling ***Larger-than-Life Bronze Likeness to be Revealed October 17***

The Frederick Art Club has announced that the outcome of its project to celebrate fashion designer Claire McCardell will be unveiled at a public ceremony Sunday, October 17, at 2 p.m.

The event is the climax of a two-year campaign to finance creation of a larger-than-life-size bronze likeness of the iconic designer, who grew up in Frederick, Maryland. In addition to the statue poised on a granite pedestal, the event will showcase an exhibit that tells Claire's success story and a donor plaque, all situated in an elegant garden.

Born and raised in Frederick, Claire McCardell (1905-1958) was an internationally known leader in the fashion industry credited with creating American sportswear. Her iconic designs uniquely defined decades of fashion and continue to influence and inspire the industry today. During her career she received numerous honors, including the Coty American Fashion Critics Award. She appeared on the cover of Time Magazine in 1955 and was named one of the most influential Americans of the 20th Century by Life magazine in 1999. Her work is held by the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Fashion Institute of Technology, the Maryland Historical Society, and Heritage Frederick, among others.

Horror Author recognized as **October's** Notable Maryland Author

Author: Thomas F. Monteleone

Genre: Horror

"Once you learn what good writing is, you'll never just read for pleasure again" - Thomas F. Monteleone



Thomas F. Monteleone (April 14, 1946) was born in Baltimore and raised in Sudbrook Park, Maryland. He attended Loyola Blakefield, a Jesuit high school, where he had teachers that challenged him to examine how he looked at the world philosophically. "One teacher told me," remembered Monteleone, "you can always ask the next question; don't ever take any particular answer for your final answer. This allowed me to trust my instincts when writing a story."

He was the first person in his family to go to college, earning degrees in English and Psychology from the University of Maryland, College Park. "My grandfather came over here from Sicily when he was 15, and he had a bakery in New York," said Monteleone. "My father worked Bethlehem Steel in a shipyard for 30 years. I came from one of those families."

Monteleone turned professional as a writer in 1972 when "Amazing Stories" magazine published one of his stories. His novelist career took off in 1975 with, *Seeds of Change*, the lead-off title in the Laser Books line of science fiction titles. This led

to Monteleone becoming a popular writer of supernatural thrillers.

His dad is responsible for Monteleone's interest in the macabre. He read pulp fiction as a young man, pulp magazines in the '30s and '40s, and he liked watching strange movies. His dad bought him comic books when he was young, and as he says, "There was a lot of strange, interesting stuff out there." Father and son went to horror films on a regular basis.

Monteleone is an extremely versatile writer. His novels, *The Resurrectionist* and *Night of Broken Souls*, have been optioned for films. He and his wife, Elizabeth, are the editors of seven anthologies. He writes a column of opinion and entertainment, *The Mothers And Fathers Italian Association*, for "Cemetery Dance" magazine. Monteleone has written creatively for both stage and television with a script produced for American Playhouse that won an Gabriel Award. In non-fiction, he is the author of the bestselling, *The Complete Idiot's Guide to Writing a Novel*. He is also very popular with his books and stories being translated into twelve foreign languages.

For years I've used gouache translucently on white watercolor paper, reveling in the luminosity glowing through thinned washes of color, and celebrating the pop of pigment when more vibrancy was needed.

But I've always known gouache is a versatile medium.

Recently I started playing with gouache on blue or tan or especially black paper, and found the effect quite compelling, even if a bit counterintuitive. Instead of feeling dark and heavy, the contrast of color seems even more brilliant.

Painting on black paper requires choosing space for the color, committing to the paint, and

claiming the light.

The duality of meaning is not lost on me and speaks to my mantra of looking up and seeking the the good, especially in the face of doubt and darkness. Every moment spent practicing this helps to quiet my heart.

This body of work is my newest exploration of my favorite medium.

KARIN BIRCH AND LISA SHEIRER BEGIN THEIR RESIDENCY ON OCTOBER 1ST for one year. THEIR FIRST OPEN STUDIO AND MICRO-GALLERY EXHIBIT will be on First Saturday November 7 pm to 9 pm

The YMCA of Frederick County, the Y Art Center, officially launches its Artist-in-Residence Studio Program on October 1 with the addition of two local artists, Karin Birch and Lisa Sheirer.

The AIR Studio Program at the Y Art Center gives residents private studio space, micro-gallery exhibit, along with marketing and professional support.

Karin Birch has been using hand embroidery and hand-stitched beadwork combined with acrylic paint as a medium for making art for 35 years. Karin Birch has exhibited nationally and internationally with works in the permanent collections of the Boston Museum of Fine Art, the Renwick Gallery in Washington DC, and the United States Embassy in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.

Lisa Sheirer is a retired art and design professor living in Frederick, Maryland. 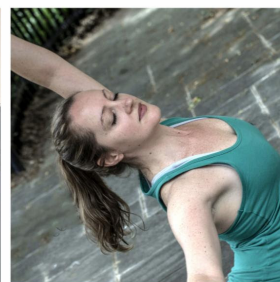
