




FAC Call for Artists

call for artists







COMFORT: art objects that represent and are integral to rituals of consumption such as tea, coffee, and other beverages, that ease our hearts, start our days, and provide a common thread to our communities. Just as we institute social rituals and make personal connections around sharing these drinks, we create art that celebrates and elevates them.

Concept: an interactive multimedia show of art related to coffee and tea, and an exploration of the rituals and personal connections surrounding those drinks.

Submission criteria: all submissions should be directly related to the service and consumption of "social" beverages like tea, coffee, and hot chocolate, or the traditions and rituals surrounding those drinks. Art exploring the role of social beverages in diverse cultures is also welcomed. For instance, appropriate subjects might be a sugar bowl, a furogama, or photographs of the coffee harvest. All work must be for sale. Works under \$200; all proceeds go to the artists. All works over \$200 are a 60/40 split between the Artist and FAC. Artists must be from the Mid-Atlantic region.

Applications must be submitted via SlideRoom no later than 11:59pm on February 10, 20203. Submissions should be made by digital photography. Each applicant can submit up to 5 pieces for consideration. All photos must be of the exact work being sent to the show. Please include the measurements, materials, and the year made.

All images should be high-resolution that would clearly enlarge to an 8x10" format. Images should be sent in .jpg format.

- For 3-D work: Use a clean, neutral backdrop, white or gradient are both acceptable. Up to 3 images per work submitted, clearly labeled.
- For 2-D work: Crop photography to minimize or eliminate background. No use of filters or other
 effects.

Dates: Submissions must be received by February 10, 2023. Acceptances will be notified by Feb 16,, 2023. All work must be received by Feb 26, 2023 for inclusion in the show. Comfort will open on March 1st with an opening reception on March 10th and run through July 1st. Artists are responsible for return shipping costs or to pick up unsold work.







Main Street Middletown welcomes the Maryland House and Garden Pilgrimage to our downtown on Saturday, May 6, 2023, for an unforgettable tour of Middletown's treasured historical properties!

The Maryland House and Garden Pilgrimage is a beloved Maryland tradition to tour the state's finest samples of architectural gems. Middletown certainly fits that description with over 250 years of architectural history compacted on its 3-mile-long Main Street situated along the Maryland historic and scenic byway, the Old National Road. Pilgrims will have access to tour the interiors of ten historic properties downtown, all within walking distance. Properties range in age, from the late 1700s to the early 20th century, and include notable Federal-style homes, elegant Victorian homes, one-of-a-kind commercial structures, and the rarely-seen interior of a turn-of-the-century operating room.

Middletown's history is based on its agricultural roots, and the pockets of in-town gardens reflect the passion for beautiful and fruitful landscapes. Lunches will be catered by <u>Tapia's on Main.</u>

The properties on the tour will have docents stationed inside each property and the event begins at 10:00 o'clock in the morning and ends at 5:00 pm.

CAPTIVATED BY THESE MINUTE SHAPES, I INTERPRET THEM IN THEIR INTRICATE ENVIRONMENTS, WHICH INFORM SCIENTISTS COMMUNAL IMAGINATION.

NEURO LAND IS A SERIES OF INSTALLATIONS ON FABRIC AND PAPER INSPIRED BY OBSERVATIONS OF BRAIN NEURON RESEARCH. IT IS BASED ON ONLINE 3D MAPPING MODELS AND MICROSCOPE IMAGERY OF BIOLOGICAL NEURAL NETWORKS. USING DIORAMA FORMAT, I INTERPRET THOSE AS IMAGINARY LANDSCAPES, CONNECTING THEM AESTHETICALLY TO JAPANESE SCREENS AND MEDIEVAL SCROLLS. THE NARRATIVE CONFIGURATION OF THESE IMAGINARY BRAIN TOPOGRAPHIES ALLOWS ME TO DESCRIBE THESE UNSEEN TERRITORIES FROM WITHIN.







NOTABLE AUTHOR: DR. BENJAMIN QUARLES

(JAN 23, 1904 – NOV 16, 1996)



Benjamin Arthur Quarles was a historian, administrator, scholar, educator, and writer. Born in Boston, MA, he attended local public schools. In 1931, he graduated with a B.A. degree from Shaw University and then earned an M.A. degree from the University of Wisconsin–Madison in 1933, followed by a Ph.D. in 1940.

His chosen profession was as a History Professor; first at Shaw, then Dillard University, and finally at Morgan State University (1953–1974) as a professor of history and chair of the department. At Morgan State, Quarles became a revered teacher and counselor and an intellectual and professional mentor for two generations of African-American scholars.

His writings portrayed blacks as active participants in major conflicts and issues of American history. His books were narrative accounts of critical wartime periods that focused on how blacks interacted with their white allies and emphasized blacks' acting as vital agents of change rather than receiving favors from whites. Many of his books became required reading in the African-American history courses that were developed in American universities during the 1960s.




