These grants are awarded with funding from both the Maryland State Arts Council and from Frederick County, and are designed to allow high-quality arts programming to be available to as many community members as possible.

To be eligible to receive a Community Arts Development (CAD) grant, your organization must be either a 501(c)(3) nonprofit arts organization or other nonprofit providing arts programming for the community.

Call for Artists: Public Art Project Opportunities in Maryland

MSAC is working with the University System of Maryland on the artist selection process for public art commissions in one Capital Improvement Project. The call is open to all US-based artists. The online application only requires a resume, letter of interest, and background images. No proposals are accepted at this stage. The Artist Selection Committee will select three semi-finalists for the project to develop artwork proposals. Semi-finalists will be offered a stipend of \$2,500 each for their time and travel.

Artists may apply for one or both of the following projects:

- Two-dimensional or low-relief artwork for the building interior (\$190,000)*

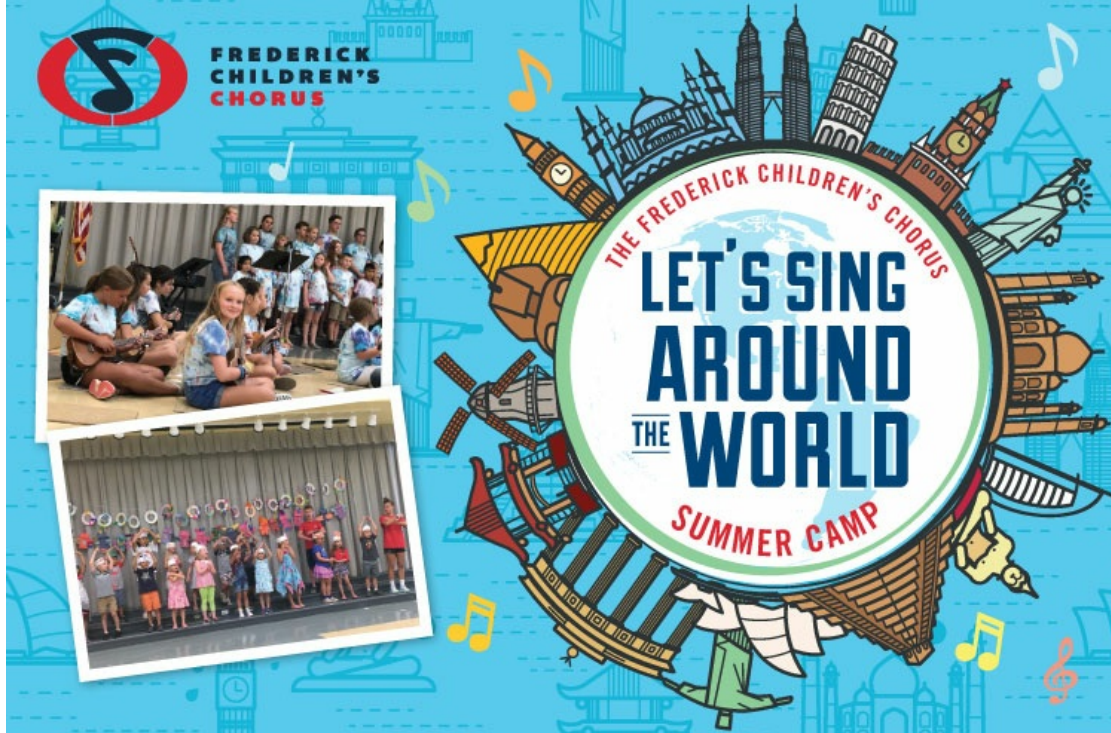

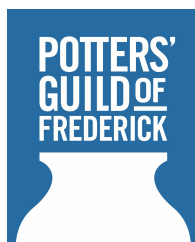



DC Backdrop Frames Author's Mysteries

Author: George P. Pelecanos

Genre: Detective Fiction

"The crime part is the engine that moves the narrative and allows me to write the other things I want to write about." – George P. Pelecanos

George P. Pelecanos (February 18, 1957) is a Maryland author whose detective fiction is set in and framed by Washington, D.C. He worked as a line cook, dishwasher, bartender, and woman's shoe salesman before publishing his first novel in 1992.

He is now the author of eighteen novels set in and around Washington, D.C. The Big Blowdown was the recipient of the International Crime Novel of the Year award in both Germany and Japan. In addition to his considerable success as an author, he has also worked as producer, writer and story editor for the award-winning US crime series, *The Wire*. His writing for the show earned him an Emmy nomination. *Esquire* magazine called him "the poet laureate of the D.C. crime world." In *Entertainment Weekly*, Stephen King wrote that Pelecanos is "perhaps the greatest living American crime writer."

When George was 19, he quit college to run his family's coffee shop on 19th Street, after his dad got sick. He did a decent job, opened on time every day, and, six months later, handed the keys back to his father. He said he was more grateful, than proud, to have had the opportunity to prove himself to his dad.

He credits his career success to following the advice of his longtime literary agent who advised against becoming obsessed with the business aspect of publishing and told him to "put his head down and keep working." George took that opportunity to work on his craft. He tried things that he otherwise would not have. George is convinced it's the best way for an author to build their career (slowly and patiently) because he makes a good living, loves his job, and is still here.

George can also claim credit for involvement in the production of feature films and miniseries, notably the World War II miniseries *The Pacific*, produced by Tom Hanks, Steven Spielberg, and HBO.

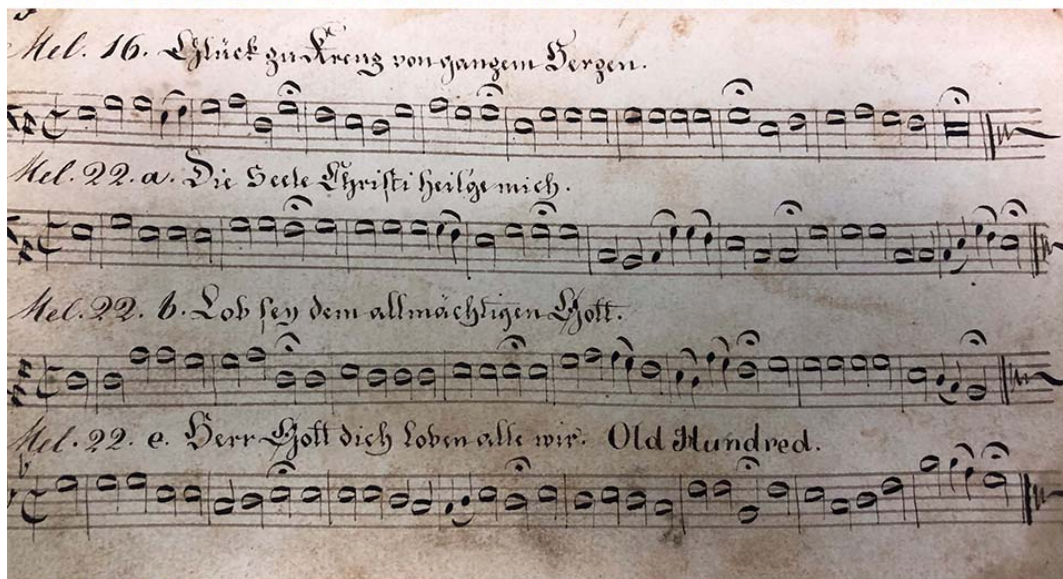

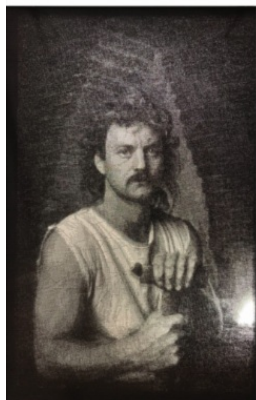

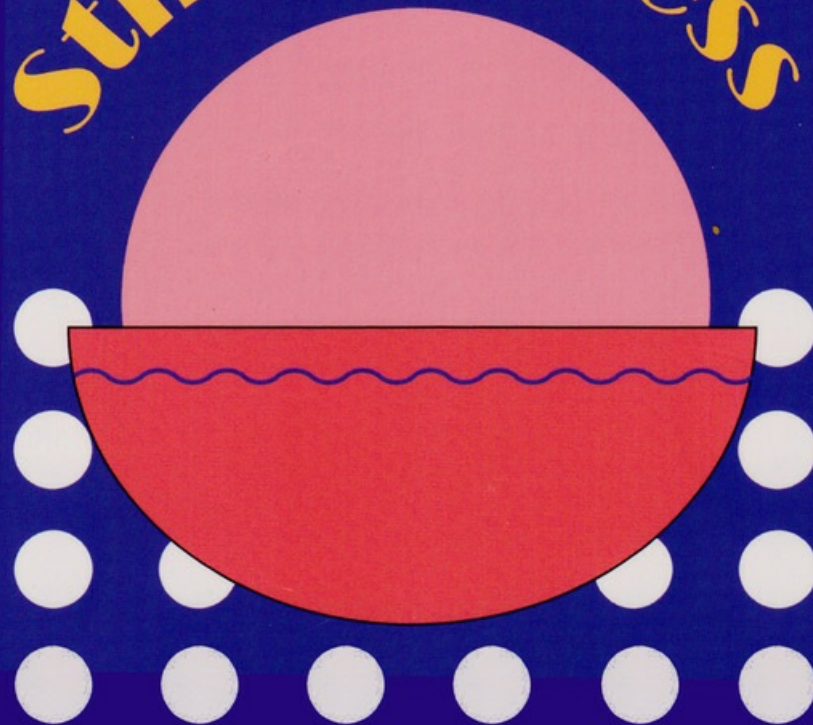
