FAC Roundtable Recap

The Frederick Arts Council had a great turnout and dynamic conversation on the future of artist workspace in Frederick, MD at last week's roundtable event!

The next steps in the short term include establishing an exploratory committee and visiting potential studio spaces in Frederick for at least 20 art studios. Long-term next steps include developing a vision for an ideal art maker space and locations, creating a field trip committee to visit successful artist work spaces in nearby towns, and establishing an advocacy committee to communicate the needs and value of artist studio space for awareness and support.



Call for Panelists: Maryland Traditions

Heritage Awards panelists will evaluate nominations for Maryland people, places, and traditions that represent long-term achievement in the traditional arts. All selected panelists will be expected to:

- Evaluate Heritage Award nominations on their own time, with all digital submissions due in winter
- Attend one required virtual orientation in fall and one synchronous virtual panel meeting in winter, as scheduled by staff
- Receive compensation of \$350, assuming the completion of all scheduled assignments

Folklife Apprenticeship panelists will evaluate applications to fund two-person teams in which traditional arts knowledge is passed from a master to an apprentice artist. All selected panelists will be expected to:

- Evaluate Folklife Apprenticeship applications on their own time, with digital submissions occurring on multiple schedules throughout the year, and individual panelist assignments set by MSAC staff
- Attend one required virtual orientation with the possibility of also attending one synchronous virtual panel meeting in spring, according to schedules set by MSAC staff
- Receive compensation of between \$350 and \$650, assuming the completion of all scheduled assignments and depending on individual panelist workload





Encouraging Maryland writers, poets, playwrights, and authors for 30 years

Author: John DeDakis

Genre: Mystery/Suspense

"Don't give up. The manuscript for my first novel went through 14 major revisions over 10 years and was rejected nearly 40 times until my current agent fell in love with it." – John DeDakis



John DeDakis (deh-DAY-kiss) is a native of La Crosse, Wisconsin. He earned a B.A. in Journalism from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1977 following a stint in the U.S. Army. From 1972-74 he was a Special Events Reporter at The American Forces Network-Europe where he interviewed legendary film director Alfred Hitchcock. DeDakis then became a General Assignment Correspondent with CBN News and was their White House Correspondent during the last three years of the Reagan presidency. He interviewed both Reagan and Jimmy Carter. In 1988, DeDakis began a 25-year career with CNN, starting as a writer. From 2001 to 2005, he supervised the writing on CNN's "Daybreak," anchored by Carol Costello. He copy-edited newscasts anchored by Donna Kelley, Leon Harris, Bill Hemmer, Daryn Kagan, Kitty Pilgrim, and Martin Savidge.

He was also a Senior Copy Editor for the Emmy and Peabody-Award winning news program "The Situation Room with Wolf Blitzer."

DeDakis has authored five Lark Chadwick mystery/suspense novels -- Fast Track, Bluff, Troubled Water, Bullet in the Chamber, and Fake. Each novel features strong-willed, strong-minded protagonist Lark Chadwick. The series begins in south central Wisconsin with a vexed, 20-something Lark trying to figure out what to do with her life. His most recent novel, Fake, has Lark thrust into a media-bashing frenzy at a time when facts are suspect, and reporters are targets. ("A gripping, topical tale about the difficulties of discerning the truth in the new world of fake news." ~Kirkus). Each story stands alone, but throughout feature the themes of journalistic integrity and mentoring relationships.

DeDakis' awards include an Emmy for his role in CNN's coverage of the 9/11 terror attacks; the American Bar Association's Gavel Award for "Judges of the Facts," a television documentary on the jury system; and an UPI Wisconsin award for "The Cubans: Freedom and Frustration," a television documentary about the Cuban Boatlift of 1980.

John and his wife Cynthia met in 1977 at St. Andrews Episcopal church in Madison, Wisconsin. They married the next year and now live in Baltimore. Cindy is a former music consultant for the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland. From 2011-2015 she was the manager of the chorister program at National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. Genre: Mystery/Suspense – Mystery features a secret whose truth is figured out based on clues, psychology, or some mix of the two. The genre emphasizes the puzzle aspect of the plot. Suspense centers on not who did it, but whether the villain will be caught before committing another crime.
