FAC Executive Director Re-Elected as Treasurer of CAAM

Frederick Arts Council Executive Director Louise Kennelly has been re-elected Treasurer of the County Arts Agencies of Maryland (CAAM) Network.



CAAM assists in furthering the Maryland State Arts Council's goals by encouraging and supporting local arts activity while championing creative expression, diverse programming, and lifelong learning throughout their jurisdictions. The County Arts Agencies of Maryland (CAAM) Network consists of the agencies and non-profits designated as official arts agencies by the governments of Maryland's 24 jurisdictions.

City of Frederick Announces Back In Business Microgrant Program



The City of Frederick COVID 19 Back In Business Conditional Microgrant Program is designed to financially assist City-based small businesses that have been substantially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and that have not previously received local assistance. Funding for this program is through the City of Frederick Department of Economic Development GROW Fund utilizing funds from Federal CARES Act through the State of Maryland and Frederick County.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Initial Program funding is \$255,000
- Applications will be accepted through an online portal from Wednesday, September 23, 2020, 9:00 a.m. through Friday, October 2, 2020, noon.
- Conditional grant awards will be announced by October 8, 2020. Disbursement of funds may take up to 15 business days from receipt of additional required documentation.
- Any eligible small business may apply and City DED staff are available to assist with application process. Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE's) are encouraged to apply.
- These conditional GROW microgrant awards are not loans and have no repayment due provided program terms have been met.
- All conditions must be met for grant disbursement. Award recipients may be audited.
- Conditional grant funds shall be used on the following items:
 - Commercial rent or mortgage payments for the business location
 - Commercial equipment/supplies needed to address safe COVID19 operations
 - Commercial utilities for the business location (such as water, sewer, electricity, etc.)
- Conditional grant funds must be expended by December 30, 2020.
- Conditional grant amounts are based on business size and will be awarded on a random lottery system from the pool of applicants.

"Over the past few years I have been exploring landscapes marked with absent human presence - the lines of agriculture, a forgotten coil of barbed wire, a dented guard rail. I look for scars, for remnants and trails. This March, I found a group of balloons in the branches of a tree. The damp Spring, the empty road, and the bright, stuck balloons seemed to echo the mood of the world - so many hopes deflating, so many dreams suspended while the dispassionate glory of nature flowed onward."

In addition to painting, Marguerite collaborates with her husband, sculptor and woodworker Tsvetomir Naydenov, in public art and stop motion film. Their kinetic portrait of Theophilus Thompson is currently on exhibit in Frederick's Carroll Creek.

The public is invited to nominate individuals, places, and traditions for outstanding achievement in traditional arts and culture. Awards are \$5,000 each. Three winners will be selected and honored at a public ceremony. Nominations are due Thursday, October 15, at 5 p.m. Begin a nomination using MSAC's application system, SmartSimple. Awards are given based on a nominee's sustained commitment to a particular traditional practice, current importance to communities in which that traditional practice is significant, and past contributions to that traditional practice. Each year, winners are chosen in the categories of Person or People, Place, and Tradition.

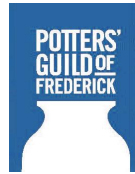

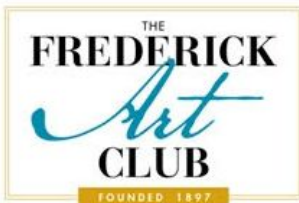
Supplemental offerings such as dance and videography are available. Programs begin at age 3 with the Little Music Makers and continue to age 18.

Claire McCardell Project Achieves Fundraising Goal



The Frederick Art Club has announced that the Claire McCardell Project has achieved its \$209,000 fundraising goal. The amount will underwrite the completion of the sculpture of the Frederick-born fashion designer, molding and casting it in bronze, installation on a granite plinth, and creation of a wayside exhibit that will tell Claire's success story.

The Frederick Art Club is now embarking on phase II: creation of a welcoming garden setting for the statue along Carroll Creek Linear Park. The club anticipates the need for an additional \$55,000 to cover landscape and hardscape design, materials and installation, lighting, benches, and other elements to create an appropriately elegant venue for Frederick's own iconic fashion designer.

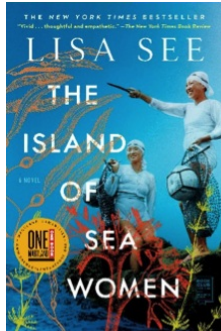

One Maryland, One Book: "The Island of Sea Women"
Author Lisa See Touring Maryland Virtually

This year, 2020 One Maryland One Book author Lisa See will make virtual visits to Maryland to discuss her book, *The Island of Sea Women*. Maryland Humanities, which coordinates One Maryland One Book, has partnered with organizations across the state for six virtual events October 4-7. All events are free. **Participants must register to receive a virtual event link.**

About the Book



The Island of Sea Women by New York Times bestselling author Lisa See chronicles the lives and friendship between Young-sook and Mi-ja, two girls living on the Korean island of Jeju. They become the closest of friends. However, their differences are impossible to ignore: Young-sook was born into a long line of haenyeo and will inherit her mother's position of leading the divers; whereas Mi-ja is the daughter of a Japanese collaborator and will forever carry that mark. From the Japanese occupation of the 1930s and 1940s to World War II to the Korean War, events will push their seemingly unbreakable bond to its breaking point.

This beautifully written and thoughtful novel shines a light on the remarkable haenyeo culture and two women who are a part of it. Readers won't soon forget the journey of Young-sook and Mi-ja's friendship.

Encouraging Maryland writers, poets, playwrights, and authors for 30 years

Author: Francis E.W. Harper

Genre: Poetry

"What matters it if they do forget the singer, so they don't forget the song. – Frances E.W. Harper



Frances Ellen Watkins Harper (1825–1911) was born free on September 24, 1825, in Baltimore, Maryland, became an orphan two years later, and was raised by her maternal aunt and uncle, Henrietta and Rev. William Watkins. She was a devout Christian.

A poet, novelist, and journalist, she was also a prominent abolitionist and temperance and women's suffrage activist. She traveled to multiple states to lecture and give speeches about these issues. In May, 1866, she delivered the speech, "We Are All Bound Up Together" at the National Women's Rights Convention in New York, sharing the stage with Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony. "You white women speak here of rights," she said. "I speak of wrongs."

With Margaret Murray Washington, the wife of Booker T. Washington, Harriet Tubman, and other prominent African American

women, Frances helped found the National Association of Colored Women and served as its vice president in 1897.

Before marrying Fenton Harper, a widower, with whom Frances had a daughter, she worked at Union Seminary in Ohio, where she taught sewing. Frances died in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on February 22, 1911. Her home still stands at 1006 Bainbridge St., Philadelphia, PA.

Frances Harper had a long and prolific writing career and is distinguished as the first African American woman to be published in the United States. She published *Forest Leaves* (1845) first book of poetry at age 20. Her collection *Poems on Miscellaneous Subjects* (1854) became her biggest commercial success. Her short story *Two Offers* was published in the *Anglo-African* in 1859 and made literary history as the first short story published by a black woman. At 67, she published her novel *Lola Leroy* (1892), which was widely praised. Many of her works reflected Christian themes of truth, justice, and redemption.

Genre: Poetry – A form of literature that evokes a concentrated imaginative awareness of experience or a specific emotional response through language chosen and arranged for its meaning, sound, and rhythm.
